PARENT FEEDBACK

This term we have sought your views as parents and guardians on a number of initiatives that we have been focussing on as a Federation. First, we asked for your feedback on was the new pupil report format.

39 parents responded across the Federation out of 300 which gives us a 13% response rate. Of these parents 95% of parents/guardians indicated that they liked and preferred the new pupil report format, 95% of parents/guardians found the reports useful and 95% of parents/guardians indicated that the reports accurately represented their child and their abilities. Of those who did not they would have preferred a more formal report.

At the end of Spring Term 2 you will be sent home an update to your Autumn report this will include information on your child's literacy, numeracy, DCF and wellbeing as well as a general comment from your child's class teacher, their AOLE journey and a QR code of your child reflecting on their learning during the Spring Term.

As part of our new school plans the Local Authority and Welsh Government have asked our pupils to encourage as many people as possible to walk or catch public transport to school. A survey was sent out by the Eco council, and they found out that most pupils across the Federation travel to school by car. Graphs were sent out to all parents and guardians to show them the results and the Eco council will be in touch soon to seek your views about transportation and the new school.
