Parent/Teacher Meeting Feedback

Thank you to all parents, carers, guardians who responded to our survey regarding our parent teacher meetings in the Autumn 1 term.

We had a total of **45** responses out of a possible **289** a response rate of **15.5%** Of the respondents **30** parents, guardians, carers had a face-to-face meeting and **15** had telephone calls.

Overall satisfaction given about the meetings out of **5** was **4.9**.

Suggestions for improvement were: Increase the number of days parent meetings are held, increase the timings of the meetings, to see the pupils' books,

Other comments given: How well staff knew the children, glad phone calls are an option for parents who cannot make meetings, staff were accommodating to meetings, seeing the books.

Over the next 3 terms we will be trialling a new reporting system we would love to have your feedback about this new way of reporting back to you each term, further information found within this newsletter.

We received 248 pupil responses for 'our voice matters' survey. Results indicate that most pupils are very happy at school, at home and with friends. However, many children do not feel as safe out and about in the community.

We will be working with our local community members to try to find a solution to this, as we want to ensure that our pupils feel safe in their own communities. All pupils had aspirations for their future careers!
